Abstract

The abstract should give a brief about the topic. It should be about 150 – 200 words. Write little bit about introduction, followed by data from literature, end the para with writing about future work required or some common findings of the literature.

Introduction

The introduction should give a brief history on the topic. Write about the current available work regarding the topic, mention what each study lacks and find common research gap. This section should be at least a full page, figures may also be inserted.

Literature Review

Author name (year). Write a brief about their work in 100 – 150 words. Cite the paper in square bracket [1]. The number shown in the bracket will be assigned to the corresponding paper in the **References** section at the last of the paper.

Each paper should have a separate para with citation in square brackets [].

Note: For a review paper at least 7 papers should be mentioned here.

Results and Discussion

In this section discuss about the results obtained by different literature, talk about common results and if any contradictions are occurring. This section should be 150 – 200 words at least.

Conclusion

In this section write a brief about the topic and how different literature has progressed the topic, if there are any research gaps, write about it and you can give your own suggestions about solving the research gaps. This section should be 100 – 150 words at least.
